This conference will be held jointly by the University of Wales Centre for Advanced Welsh and Celtic Studies and the National Library of Wales to celebrate the publication of *A Repertory of Welsh Manuscripts and Scribes* by Daniel Huws. The plenary speakers will be David Dumville, Ceridwen Lloyd-Morgan, Bernard Meehan, Paul Russell and Richard Sharpe.

Proposals are invited for 25-minute papers, in either Welsh or English, on any aspect of Welsh, Latin or English manuscripts of Welsh provenance, including their construction, paleography, illustrations, scribes, patrons and collectors, preservation, textual studies and digital presentation.

Papers by research students will be welcome, as well as by established scholars, and students may apply for bursaries towards their attendance costs. A manuscript studies training day is planned for 8 September 2020.
